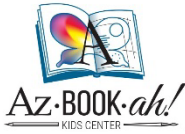

### 2026 Summer Program Overview

Our 9-week Summer Art Program invites children on an exciting creative journey around the world — and even beyond!

From underwater painting and clay sculptures of sea creatures to 3D dimensional projects inspired by the cultures of different continents (Africa, Australia, Antarctica, and Asia), children will explore world art, learn the basics of sewing, and experiment with a variety of mixed media techniques.

Throughout the summer, children will:

- create and sew their own soft toys and dolls;
- build a fairy-tale cottage from natural materials;
- complete vibrant three-dimensional compositions;
- enjoy active outdoor time and water play;
- construct origami art and handmade greeting cards.

Each project is designed to foster creative thinking, fine motor skills, independence, and self-confidence.

We create a warm, natural, and calm atmosphere without stress or overload, where each child can grow and express themselves at their own pace.

Projects are flexibly adapted to children's interests, age, and individual characteristics, ensuring that every child feels genuinely engaged and comfortable.

**Format:** Classes are less academic and more play-based — an engaging blend of fun and skill-building 😊 Morning playground time and outdoor games are included daily. Every week offers a unique theme and experience.

Here is the detailed program of our summer artistic journey — each week brings a new country, new techniques, and new creative discoveries!

**Week 1 (June 22–26): Underwater World**

A deep dive into the mysterious world of the ocean! Children will paint with acrylics and watercolors, create sensory 3D crafts, and sculpt sea creatures from clay. This week nurtures imagination, tactile awareness, and a love for nature.

**Week 2 (July 6–10): Africa**

A vibrant and inspiring week dedicated to the culture and nature of Africa. The main project is a large-scale dimensional piece, “World in a Box,” combining painting and sculpting. Children learn spatial thinking and how to develop a large project step by step.

**Week 3 (July 13–17): Australia**

Exploring Australia’s unique animals and landscapes. Children will create artwork and sew their own soft toy — their first intentional “from idea to finished product” creative experience.

**Week 4 (July 20–24): Antarctica**

We explore the most mysterious continent! Children will draw and sculpt Antarctic animals and complete a collaborative 3D project, “Antarctica.” This week develops precision, perseverance, and teamwork skills.

**Week 5 (July 27–31): Asia**

An introduction to Eastern aesthetics: Asian-style

painting, clay modeling, and soft toy creation. Children learn to appreciate beauty in details and experiment with new artistic approaches.

**Week 6 (August 3–7): Doll Making**

A true design workshop! Each child will design and create their own doll, learn basic sewing skills, and practice simple embroidery elements. This week is especially valuable for developing patience, fine motor skills, and self-confidence.

**Week 7 (August 10–14): Fairy Tale Cottage**

Building a magical cottage from cardboard and natural materials. Children design, construct, and decorate — combining creativity with early engineering thinking.

**Week 8 (August 17–21): The World of 3D Art**

Dimensional mixed-media projects using acrylics, natural materials, and colored paper. Creative work is balanced with active outdoor play and water activities — a healthy blend of art and movement.

**Week 9 (August 24–28): Origami and Handmade Cards**

The final week focuses on the delicate art of paper folding and creating personalized greeting cards. Children develop focus and precision while completing the summer with beautiful, original creations.

Each week is thoughtfully designed so children not only create vibrant projects, but also develop imagination, spatial thinking, fine motor skills, independence, and confidence — all within a calm, supportive, and inspiring environment.
